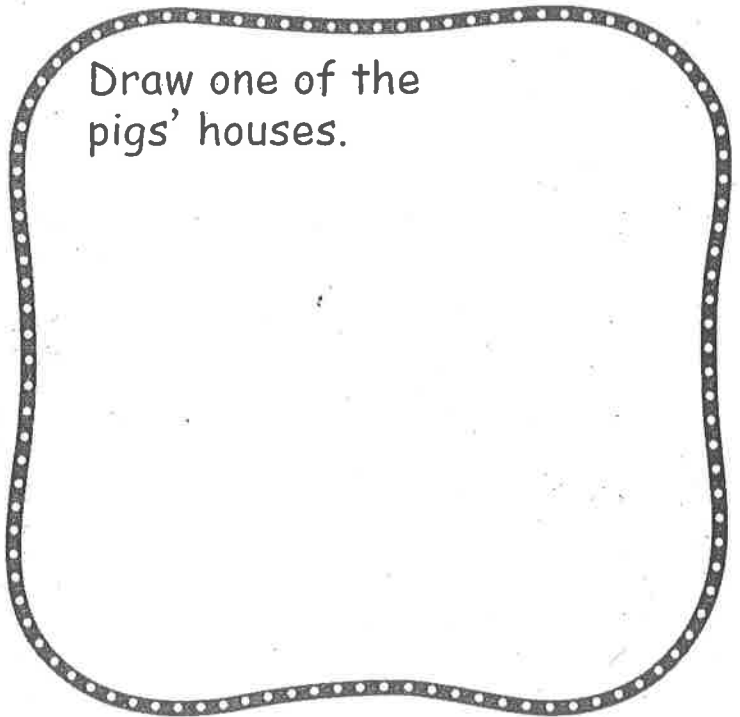

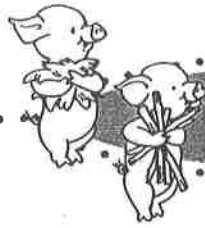

The Three Little Pigs



Help each pig get to its house.
Each pig can move only on its own shape.
Use a different color to show each path.
