

Jellies



Jellyfish do not have bones, brains or hearts and they have no eyes. Jellyfish are carnivores, so they eat other sea animals. They are not able to chew their food, so they eat small fish, lobsters, shrimp and plankton that they swallow whole. They can also eat smaller jellyfish. Jelly fish swim by pulsing their bell-shaped body. Some jellies live for a short time, others for 70 years, one kind called the immortal jellyfish can reverse its life cycle. This means that it can live forever as long as it is not killed by something else. Jellies can regrow lost body parts. The tentacles of a

jellyfish are covered in tiny, stinging cells, when it touches its prey a poison stuns the prey. The Lion's Mane Jellyfish is the largest jellyfish in the world, about the same length as a blue whale!
